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

Definition

"Human rights are the notion that every human being has universal, inalienable rights, regardless of the law in the country where they live."

- The right to live.
- The right to be free.
- The right to equality.
- The right to be helped.
- The right to be educated.





The European Union is committed to supporting democracy and human rights in its external relations, in accordance with its founding principles of liberty, democracy, respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms, and the rule of law.

Human Rights Convention



The European Convention on Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms aims to guarantee individual rights and freedoms within the 46 signatory states.

It is not an offshoot of the European Union, but the Lisbon Treaty provides for the EU to accede to it.



The European Court of Human Rights is the international organisation that monitors compliance with the Convention.



EU HUMAN RIGHTS POLICY

2012

 Human Rights Charter = Strategic Framework on Human Rights and Democracy + action plan (for the 10 following years)

2020

 EU action plan on democracy (2020-2024)

5 Main Areas

- 1-Protecting and empowering individuals
- 2-Building resilient, inclusive and democratic societies
- 3-Promoting a global system for human rights and democracy
- 4-New technologies: harnessing opportunities and addressing challenges
- 5-Delivering by working together

These directives are *not* legally binding; they give third world countries instructions about EU Regulations during political dialogues

Human Right Policies in the EU: The Charter of Fundamental Human Rights (2012)

- created on 26th October 2012
- respecting these rights required to become EU member

Aim: "The peoples of Europe, in creating an ever closer union among them, are resolved to share a peaceful future based on common values."

Since 1959: European Court of Human Rights



Ensuring Compliance with the Commitments undertaken by the Signatory States to the European Convention on Human Rights

Composed of the 46 Countries of the European Council



HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATION EXAMPLE:

Société

« la poitrine dénudée » devant l'autel. La France avait prononcé une peine de prison






3 CONCRETE MEASURES:

- Creation of a coherent policy document concerning human rights guidelines that a specfic country must follow within 3 years
- EUR 1.362 billion allocated for the period 2021-2027: thematic programme on Human Rights and Democracy
- The December 2020 regulation establishing a global human rights sanction regime.

Examples: Why Violation of Human Rights in EU Countries is still relevant today

• Gender Equality — full equality still not reached; highest equality in Danmark, Finnland, Sweden; lower equality in Greece, Cyprus



Right to Asylum + Prohibition of Inhuman Treatment — Police
 Violence and treatment of immigrants most condemned offences (f.ex. 2011: European Court of Human Rights (ECHR) announced shifting
 Migrants to Greece and their treatment as violating Human Rights due to inhuman living conditions)



To ensure that the Charter is upheld, the EU must:

withhold funding from countries that violate the Charter terms


