



Referencing

When I make a statement or provide data, where does it come from? I must 'reference' the information.

Spot where referencing is needed.

Each statement now has a reference. We need to find the reference in the bibliography

Make at least two statements in your writing and provide the source. Copy the full reference which you will need in the bibliography.

Quotations (citations)

Make it easy to see that you are quoting someone, so that it is not seen as plagiarism.

"We had no respect for traditional wisdom or the restraints of custom. We lacked everyone" (Rosenbaum, 1995, p95)

Indented (not on the left margin). Italic. The reference to the author will be found in the bibliography.

Make a quotation (maybe from one of the articles, or else make one up) and include it in your article.
