- 23M non-EU citizens (5% of population); arrivals legal & illegal for safety, study, work
- Demographic crisis: ageing, shrinking workforce, labour shortages (health, construction, digital)
- Tension: migration as solution vs. public pressure on control & identity
- 2015 crisis: 1M+ asylum seekers (mainly Syria) → polarization
- EU measures: Frontex, Dublin Regulation, relocation quotas → fragmented & divisive
- · Care question: Can the FII build a truly common migration

Key data on migration in the EU



• In 2022: 3 million residence permits issued

The Mediterranean Sea: the deadliest border in the world. 30,000 deaths between 2014 and 2024.

 The EU's working-age population: decline by 35 million people by 2050

· Significant heterogeneity between **Member States**: (Germany, Hungary, Poland)

Dublin regulation:


First-entry country → handles asylum request
