• imports exceed exports : trade imbalance.



- Germany first exporter to China, followed by France.
- Germany first importer followed by the Netherlands.


AFFORDABLE GOODS



Lower Costs : China's production efficiency reduces prices for European businesses and consumers.

Competitive Advantage : EU companies save on production expenses, helping them compete globally.






2. EXPORT POTENTIAL TO

Rising Demand : A growing Chinese middle class boosts demand for luxury items, pharmaceuticals, and machinery.

Export Growth : The EU exported €230 billion to China in 2023, with Germany, France, and Italy benefiting most.

Successful Brands: Companies like LVMH and BMW experience strong growth in China's premium market.






China dominates EU solar panel imports





Regulatory Influence : By setting standards and negotiating trade, Europe can shape global policies.



CRITICISMS AND CHALLENGES


China's Aggressive Industrial Policy

- LACK OF TRANSPARENCY
- UNFAIR COMPETITION BETWEEN EUROPEAN AND CHINESE STATE-OWNED COMPANIES (EX: SOLAR PANELS)
- CONCERNS ABOUT CYBERSECURITY AND ECONOMIC SPYING (EX: HUAWEI)










CRITICISMS AND CHALLENGES

BELT AND ROAD INITIATIVE (BRI) (NEW SILK ROAD)

- launched by China in 2013
- countries are forced to cede their strategic position (ex: Sri Lanka)
- EU fears China's expansion into the Mediterranean Sea (ex: Piraeus' port in Greece)






CRITICISMS AND CHALLENGES

EU Trade Deficit with China and Economic Dependence

- growing dependence on Chinese imports
- Trade deficit increasing through the years (164B€ in 2019 to 304B€ in 2024)
- dependence weakens Europe and need to diversify supply sources




EU MEASURES



- Customs duties
- Anti-dumping measures.



Strengthening legislation



 Investment in its own production and strategic autonomy



 Europe focuses on economic diplomacy and dialogue with China



CONCLUSION

- Mixed Impact: EU benefits from trade but faces imbalances and competition.
- Economic Gains: Lower costs, higher exports, and business expansion.
- Challenges: Unfair competition, cybersecurity risks, and dependence.
- Strategic Leverage: Influence on global policies and green initiatives.
- **EU Response**: Anti-dumping policies, industry growth, and diversification.
