Since the 1990s Europe has experienced a context of harmonization of the European higher education area

linitiated by 4 countries: France, Germany, the United Kingdom and Italy, during the declaration of the Sorbonne in 1998

The Bologna Process: 40 European countries, 5500 institutions and over 30 million students

creation in 2010 of the European higher education area, made up of 48 States

Each academic semester corresponds to 30 credits
