

Plan of Keynes



Keynes represented the United Kingdom and proposed a system of international compensation.




Key idea: create a global currency, the bancor, managed by an International Clearing Union.



Objective:

- Avoid excessive trade imbalances
- Sanction countries with excessive surpluses or deficits.
- Ensure a balanced recovery of the global economy..

Harry Dexter White's opposition

The United States is the world's leading economic power, and prefers a system based on the

Result: adoption of a compromise:

- Creation of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank.
- (until 1971).
- Keynes fails to impose the bancor.

- dollar as the reference currency.

• A system in which the dollar is convertible into gold

Keynes' legacy in the international monetary system

Keynes' Influence on the IMF and Global Economic Policies

1971 saw the end of the Bretton Woods system, proving that the dollar-based model had its limits.







Today, Keynes remains a reference point for debates on reforming the global monetary system.
